

Camper Equipment Checklist – What to Bring

We suggest that each item of clothing and equipment is labeled with the Scout's name, address and troop number. This will be helpful in returning lost items to their owners.

Uniform

- Official shirt (BSA Class A uniform)
- Official shorts/long pants
- Scout belt
- Scout socks (2 pair)

Camp Uniform (used daily-3 days)

- Troop 700 t-shirts
- Handkerchief or bandana (Scout neckerchief should be left home so it won't be lost)
- Socks (3-5 pair)
- Jacket
- Swim trunks
- Rain coat/rain suit
- Underwear
- Hiking shoes and tennis shoes (closed toe)

Necessary Equipment

- Bath towel and soap with dish
- Shower shoes (closed toe)
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Comb or brush
- Drinking cup
- Water bottle/canteen
- Sleeping bag or 3 blankets and pillow
- Cot or sleeping pad (cots are not available at camp)
- Sleepwear
- Flashlight (extra batteries)
- Bible or prayer book
- Scout handbook
- Scout fieldbook
- Small backpack (book bag)
- Notebook paper and pencil or pen
- Jeans (long pants)
- Insect repellent (non aerosol)
- Hat or cap
- Sunscreen
- COMPLETED Annual Health and Medical Record (34605)

Optional Equipment

- Wristwatch
- Sunglasses
- Personal first aid kit
- Musical instrument
- Sewing kit
- Camera
- Binoculars
- Clothes line (and clothes pins)
- Mosquito netting
- Work gloves
- Battery operated fan
- Envelopes, paper, stamps (don't forget to write home)
- Mask, fins, snorkel
- Survival kit (for Wilderness Survival Merit Badge)
- Fishing pole and tackle (license if 17 or older)
- Spending money
